Carbon Dioxide (CO ) is released when fossil fuels (e.g., coal, oil and natural gas) are burned. 2 Carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, is a major contributor to global warming. Nitrogen Oxides (NOX) form when fossil fuels and biomass are burned at high temperatures. They contribute to acid rain and ground-level ozone (or smog), and may cause respiratory illness in children with frequent high level exposure. NOX also contribute to oxygen deprivation of lakes and coastal waters which is destructive to fish and other animal life. Sulfur Dioxide (SO ) is formed when fuels containing sulfur are burned, primarily coal and oil. 2 Major health effects associated with SO include asthma, respiratory illness and aggravation of 2 existing cardiovascular disease. SO2 combines with water and oxygen in the atmosphere to form acid rain, which raises the acid level of lakes and streams, and accelerates the decay of buildings and monuments.
